

Forgiveness liberates us from betrayal, anger, and resentment, embodying the way of Jesus. It empowers us to reclaim control from those who have hurt us and grants inner peace. Through His great love and forgiveness, Jesus Christ redeemed us. Forgiveness is central to His Great Commandment of Love: love God, your neighbor, yourself—even your enemy—as He loves us. Yet, many reject this teaching, refusing to

forgive those who hurt them or even themselves for past mistakes. Unforgiveness traps us, breaking our relationships with God, others, and ourselves. We cannot expect forgiveness from God or others if we withhold it. Redemption begins in our hearts through love, forgiveness, and reconciliation. If your heart is burdened by unforgiveness, this retreat offers freedom from past pain.

# Anxiety Disorders - Panic Disorder

Panic disorder involves frequent and unexpected panic attacks - sudden periods of intense discomfort, fear, or sense of losing control. These panic attacks can occur as frequently as several times a day or as rarely as a few times a year.

#### Signs and Symptoms

- During a panic attack, a person may experience: managing symptoms.
- Rapid heart rate or chest pain
- Shortness of breath
- Sweating
- Trembling or tingling
- Feelings of doom or imminent danger
- Feeling out of control
- Chills or hot flashes
- Nausea

#### Get Help

Treatments, such as medicines and therapy, help most people with anxiety disorders.

Support groups and learning stress management techniques can also assist with managing symptoms.

# How Do We Wait and Prepare?

What is the secret to sharing in God's power to overcome our difficulties? Mary teaches us this in the prophecy of her pierced heart. This Sunday, the old man Simeon prophecies that when her son faces opposition, Mary's soul will be pierced by a sword.

The seemingly pointless agony of a mother helplessly watching her son be mocked, tortured, killed and then cruelly desecrated in death by a spear

— somehow this piercing of her heart releases a power by which "the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed" (Luke 2:35). What to make of this?

Whatever problems we currently face, the deepest threat is finally that evil thoughts are hidden in the human heart: hatred, envy, pride, lust, greed and so



on. Behind every tyrant's injustice, for example, is a heart unpierced by love. Evil hides in our hearts. Mary's pierced heart, and its suffering love for her son, reveals and scatters these evil thoughts, and replaces them with love, forgiveness, generosity and peace.

This week, I invite us to ponder Mary's pierced heart. Her heart is quietly at work for us in the Church and world, exposing our evil

thoughts and making a path for her son's divine love.

This is how she gently cooperates in our salvation. Closed hearts are our biggest problem; love-pierced hearts are the ultimate power to overcome every difficulty. — Father John Muir ©LPi

# The Thoughts of Many Hearts By Colleen Jurkiewicz Dorman

When Simeon cradles the infant Messiah in his arms, he speaks of salvation and glory and revelation. He speaks of his own death. He speaks of the fulfillment of God's promise to all people.

But most memorable, in my opinion, are his words about the hearts of men. This Child, he says, will be the way "the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed."

Perhaps you're like me. Perhaps you don't enjoy scrutinizing yourself, your actions, your intentions. You don't like reflecting on why you feel or react the way you do, and you really don't enjoy measuring those feelings and reactions against what you know they could be.

It's exhausting to sit with God, your heart in your hands, both of us looking at it, talking about it. So far too often, I opt out.

The oldest trick of the devil, you see, is to distract us from thinking about our hearts. It's not hard for him to

It is thought to have originated in the first century A.D. and was sent by the pope to Emperor Charles as he went into battle. It is said that those who recite this prayer will not suffer a sudden death and will likewise be protected from drowning, the effects of poison and fire, falling into the hands of the enemy or being overpowered in battle. ## RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) or OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults)?

While reading the Bulletin, I noticed an activity listed as O.C.I.A., a term I was unfamiliar with. Curious if it might be a misprint, I inquired and was informed that it is correct. Wanting to know more, I did some research and here's what I learned:

In November 2021, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops decided to change the name from R.C.I.A. (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) to O.C.I.A. (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults). This change was made to better reflect the "order" of the various "rites" involved in the process. The original Latin name, *Ordo Initiationis Christianae* 

Adultorum, aligns with this new terminology, making O.C.I.A. a more accurate translation.

The stages of O.C.I.A., known as "the Rites," include the following: Inquiry, Catechumenate, Purification, Initiation, and Enlightenment. However, not everyone is required to complete the full process.

### Prison Ministry Offers Residents Encounter Christ (REC) Retreat at Whetstone Prison

The first Residents Encounter Christ (REC) retreat was held at Whetstone Correctional Facility on January 10-12. Seven of the fifteen volunteers were Santa Catalina Parishioners (47%). The theme for REC01 was: "Put on the whole armor of God, that you

may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil." (Eph 6:11).

Over three days, volunteers gave Christian talks followed by table discussions. Day 1, "Dying to Self and Changing," focused on understanding God's

forgiveness through Christ. Day 2, "Rising Again," emphasized the peace of knowing God is with us. Day 3, "Going Forth," encouraged inmates to be Christian examples and share their testimonies.

Twenty-six "Men-in-Orange" (Brothers-in-Christ) and fifteen volunteers, including two from NY, attended. More than half the men were non-Catholic



Christians. Some admitted they had misconceptions about Catholics, which changed during the retreat. One man initially rejected the retreat because of the Rosary but stayed after encouragement from Chaplain Wentz. He left feeling prepared for his return to the outside world this month. We hope to make this retreat an annual event at Whetstone and expand to other Wilmot complex prisons.
