



Mental Health and Substance Use Co-Occurring Disorders

More than one in four adults living with serious mental health problems also has a substance use problem. Substance use problems occur more frequently with certain mental health problems, including:

Substance Use Disorder Symptoms

Behavioral changes such as:

- Drop in attendance and performance at work or school
- Frequently getting into trouble (fights, accidents, illegal activities)
- Engaging in secretive or suspicious behaviors
- Changes in appetite or sleep patterns
- Unexplained change in personality or attitude
- Sudden mood swings, irritability, or angry outbursts
- Periods of unusual hyperactivity, agitation, or giddiness
- Lack of motivation
- Appearing fearful, anxious, or paranoid, with no reason

- Depression
- Anxiety Disorders
- Schizophrenia
- Personality Disorder

Physical changes such as:

- Bloodshot eyes and abnormally sized pupils
- Sudden weight loss or weight gain Engaging in secretive or suspicious behaviors
- Deterioration of physical appearance: Unusual smells on breath, body, or clothing
- Tremors, slurred speech, or impaired coordination

Social changes such as:

- Sudden change in friends, favorite hangouts, and hobbies
- Legal problems related to substance use
- Unexplained need for money or financial problems
- Using substances even though it causes problems in relationships

Treatment Someone with a mental health problem and substance use disorder must treat both Issues, Treatment for both mental health problems and substance use disorders may Include rehabilitation, medications, support groups, and talk therapy.

St. Patrick's Breastplate, Explained

St. Patrick's Breastplate (sometimes called The Lorica of St. Patrick) is an ancient Irish prayer attributed to St. Patrick. The prayer first appears in the *Liber Hymnorum*, an IIth-century collection of Irish and Latin hymns, where it is said that Patrick sang these words when he was besieged by the anti-Christian chieftain Lóegaire.

The prayer's most famous excerpt contains an invocation that Christ be "with me, before me, behind me, beneath me, above me, on my right, on my left, when I lie down, when I sit down, in the heart of every man who thinks of me, in the mouth of every man who speaks of me, in the eye that sees me, in the ear that hears me." The prayer's complete version can be divided into eleven sections, each calling upon different elements of divine protection, binding those who recite it to the strength of the Trinity. ©LPi

Gospel Reflection

"Put Out into the Deep" Lk 5:4

Jesus calls us beyond our limited expectations.

When He told Peter, "put out into the deep," it wasn't just about fishing—it was about trust. After a long, fruitless night, Peter listened, cast his nets again, and experienced an overwhelming catch.

We live in a world that celebrates self-sufficiency, power, and control, yet Jesus invites us to surrender for something greater. True faith means stepping out



into uncertainty and trusting in God's abundance rather than relying solely on our own strength.

> I see Peter's story as a refreshing reminder that when we dare to venture beyond our comfort zones, God's generosity surprises us. So, where is Jesus inviting you to cast your nets today? Let's be attentive to that invitation, to trust beyond our understanding, and to serve with love that exceeds our own limits.

Priest Shortage

Question:

Would optional celibacy help the priest shortage?

Answer:

This is a hotly debated topic. There are good arguments on both sides, and there is no clear answer that emerges. However, the shortage of clergy in denominations that do allow marriage would seem to indicate that optional celibacy is not the quick answer that some might think. No one solution is perfect. Each one has its flaws and problems that are not easily solved. While optional celibacy would open ordination to some great men who are married, it also brings the problems of

family, financial support, marital problems, and issues — good and bad — of childrearing. So it would not seem that optional celibacy is a realistic solution to the shortage of clergy.

With all of the varied challenges and problems facing the Church, it is easy to forget that the Holy Spirit leads us. Openness, dialogue, and education are second to our prayers and petitions to the Holy Spirit to make clear the path the Church should follow. A response that is rooted in a culture of political correctness is almost certainly doomed; a response that is rooted in prayer and in God cannot fail. ©LPi

1 love today's Gospel passage, and not just because 1 love a good fish fry.

1 love it because 1 am Peter. Over and over again, 1 am Peter, standing here exhausted because I relied on my own abilities, and it got me nowhere. I'm ready to call it letting yourself be changed by what He chooses to quits. I'm ready to say it's too hard. And here comes Jesus, asking me to lower my net. To keep trying.

And I try to talk sense into him. "It's not going to work, God," I insist. "I've been trying."

"You've been trying," Jesus agrees. "But you haven't asked for my help yet."

What does it mean to lower your net? It sounds so simple and so easy, but it takes a great deal of humility and trust. I think I'm the expert on my own life, the

captain of my own ship. Peter probably thought so, too he was the fisherman, after all. Why would a fisherman listen to a carpenter on matters of fishing?

Lowering your net means giving God control and show you.

It means to listen to God's instructions, even when you don't understand them, even when you find them frustrating. It means to keep trying the hard thing that you know is the right thing, even when it hasn't born much fruit. It means to keep loving the person who is making life hard on you, even when all you want to do is give into feelings of bitterness and distrust.

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) or OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults)?

While reading the Bulletin, I noticed an activity listed as O.C.I.A., a term I was unfamiliar with. Curious if it might be a misprint, I inquired and was informed that it is correct. Wanting to know more. I did some research and here's what I learned:

In November 2021, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops decided to change the name from R.C.I.A. (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) to O.C.I.A. (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults). This change was made to better reflect the "order" of the various "rites" involved in the process. The original Latin name, Ordo Initiationis Christianae



Prison Ministry Offers Residents Encounter Retreat at Whetstone - Part 2

This is the second article about prison ministry • that many Santa Catalina parishioners are participating in. At the end of the January retreat each brother-in-Christ was asked to share how the retreat affected them. Here are some of their comments:

• This meant a lot to me. God is with me wherever 1

- am. 1 was not sure 1 could ever experience love here, but 1 found love this weekend in this facility.
- 1 had to come to prison so that God could tell me what 1 need to do (to give back to others).
- 1 had a lot of preconceived notions about Catholics that were changed during this weekend.
- After this retreat, I feel that everything is going to be okay especially surrounded by fellow Christian companions. God is working through the Holy Spirit.
- 1 am leaving soon. Thank you for this retreat. 1 can carry this with me for the rest of my life.
- I have been in prison 20 years and only had 1 visit. The rest of the world views us as castaways, but the love shared by the people who came in for this weekend was amazing.
- This REC has been awesome and 1 have 34 days before release and this has put me on the right path. 1 have experienced a lot of pain and was on the wrong path.
- Next year 1 am being released. 1 am afraid, but it feels comfortable now because 1 have the armor of God.

The world turns it's back on us. They see us as lesser people. Initially my family turned against me and every person who I helped did too. I have seen the face of Christ in all the volunteers here.

- I just walked over to get my insulin shot and I noticed as I walked no one talked or looked at each other. For me this is going to change because you can't tell someone about Jesus Christ if you can't even say hello as you walk past them.
- I've been trying to get my head cleared by going to AA and since October I've been to over 200 meetings. I appreciate the volunteers caring so much (he sobbed). This will definitely help me get closer to God. I'm going to implement all that I've learned (blows his nose) to become a better man and to go to treatment and become the man God wants me to be.
- We are spiritual athletes. We need to find a passion. Everyone talks about getting into the end zone, but the end zone is really the beginning zone where life begins. Our job is just to work at it so we can get the first down as Eli said to Samuel, "Here I am Lord", so Coach put me in!
